

Career Development

Pharmacy Technician

The Pharmacy Technician course prepares students to work in pharmaceutical settings, under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist. Classroom and practical areas of instruction include learning to assist a licensed pharmacist in dispensing medications, maintaining inventory, assessing medication orders, pharmacy billing services and providing customer service. Upon successful completion, the student will be awarded a certificate of completion from the University of Texas at Arlington and will become eligible to sit for the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) exam. Certifying bodies require documents as proof of employment eligibility.

An additional hands-on course in Sterile Pharmaceutical Compounding (see course description) is recommended. Discount offered upon dual registration for Pharmacy Technician and Sterile Pharmaceutical Compounding.

Hours: 120 hours classroom, 160 hours externship.

Prerequisites: Registrants should have a high school diploma or equivalent. Current immunizations, a criminal background check and drug screen may be required before externship placement and/or registering with the State of Texas.

Fees: \$3900 (Includes Pharmacy Technician tuition, uniform, textbooks, background check, and drug screen.)

Sterile Pharmaceutical Compounding

This course is designed to offer additional training in sterile pharmaceutical processes to new technician graduates and professionals in the pharmacy field. This is a comprehensive course in the aseptic preparation of sterile pharmaceutical products. Utilizing a step by step approach, students are taught how to work in an ISO 5 environment. The course addresses everything from basic hand washing, needle and syringe technique through the complex compounding of TPN solutions. Emphasis is placed on the USP 797 regulations for the preparation of sterile compounds. In addition to instruction, this course includes 20 hours of hands on preparation of sterile products. Upon successful completion of this course the student is eligible to apply for ACPE certification in Sterile Pharmaceutical Compounding. Certifying bodies require documents as proof of employment eligibility.

Hours: 20 hours classroom, 20 hours sterile compounding

Prerequisite: Successful completion of Pharmacist or Pharmacy Technician training.

Fees: \$1950, or \$1300 if enrolled in the UT Arlington Continuing Education Pharmacy Technician Program. Both fee options include textbooks, personal protection wear, and

Career Development

Patient Care Technician

This course prepares the student for employment in various medical facilities. Through classroom and practical instruction, the student will learn to assist with in-patient and out-patient care. Classroom and practical instruction includes bedside care; obtaining vital signs, measurements and blood samples; and recording electrocardiograms. Upon successful completion, the student will be awarded a certificate of completion from UT Arlington and is eligible to sit for the Nurse's Aide certification exam with the State of Texas, as well as the National Health (CNA) Career Association's certification exams for ECG/EKG, Phlebotomy, and Patient Care Technician. Certifying bodies require documents as proof of employment eligibility.

Hours: 225 hours classroom, 120 hours externship

Prerequisites: Registrants should have a high school diploma or equivalent; proof of health insurance; current immunizations and the ability to lift 50 lbs.

Fee: \$5400* (Includes tuition, uniform, textbooks, background check, drug screening, EKG caliper, stethoscope, Tb testing, CPR certification and certification exams fees)

ECG/EKG Technician

This course offers classroom and practical instruction on obtaining electrocardiograms in healthcare settings. Instruction includes patient preparation, use and maintenance of the electrocardiograph and methods for obtaining an electrocardiogram. Students will also learn how to recognize abnormalities on the electrocardiogram. This course is perfect for the student looking to enter the healthcare field as well as the healthcare professional looking to acquire additional skills. Upon successful completion of the course the student will receive a certificate of completion from UT Arlington and will become eligible to sit for the certification exam with the National Health Career Association. Certifying bodies require documents as proof of employment eligibility.

Hours: 80 hours classroom, 160 hours externship.

Prerequisites: Registrants should have a high school diploma or equivalent; current immunizations; proof of health insurance; and the ability to lift 50 lbs.

Fee: \$2000 (Includes textbook, uniform, EKG caliper, CPR certification, and EKG Technician certification exam fee)

Phlebotomy Technician

This course is designed for individuals interested in becoming phlebotomists. The classroom and practical skills introduced include anatomy and physiology of the blood system, procedures used to obtain various blood specimens; common blood testing; specimen handling and preparation; and safety standards. This course is perfect for the student looking to enter the healthcare field as well as the healthcare professional looking to acquire additional skills. Upon successful completion of the course the student will be awarded a certificate of completion from UT Arlington and will become eligible to sit for the Phlebotomy Technician certification exam with the National Healthcare Association. Certifying bodies require documents as proof of employment eligibility.

Hours: 100 hours classroom, 160 hours externship

Prerequisites: Registrants should have a high school diploma or equivalent; current immunizations; proof of health insurance; and the ability to lift 50 lbs.

Fee: \$3000* (Includes textbook, uniform, personal protective wear, CPR certification, and Phlebotomy Technician certification

Policies

Student Withdrawal and Transfer Policy
Students have several options available should they need to withdraw from

a class. Please note that all student withdrawal requests must be received Monday-Friday during normal business hours.

If the student withdrawal request is received more than one full business day prior to the class start date, students have the following three options:

· Transfer to another course with no charge;

Have the funds held on the student's account for up to one year.

These funds would be eligible for a refund, less a \$20 processing fee; or • Full refund of the course fee, less a \$20 processing charge. Allow 4-6 weeks processing time for refunds made by check.

Allow 2 weeks for refunds by credit card. If the course withdrawal request is received within one full business day prior to the start of the course or on the day of the course, students have the following

Transfer to another course with no charge; or

 Have the funds held on the student's account for up to one year. These funds are not eligible for refund.

No transfers, account holds, or refunds are allowed once a class has begun. Courses in our Medical Programs, Certificate in Professional Human Resource Management, online courses, conferences and other specified programs have unique refund policies. Contact our office for details.

Free parking is provided for all classes scheduled at the Continuing Education Workforce Development Building located at 140 West Mitchell, Arlington, TX 76019. Classes scheduled at all other campus locations require the students to display a UT Arlington Parking Permit (hang tag), which is included in the cost of the course fee. Hang tags are distributed on the first day of class. Please remember to display the hang tag each time you attend class to avoid a citation.
